



Brave Trails & EarthHero

Brave Trails has been dedicated to creating a fun and inclusive summer camp experience for LGBTQ+ youth since opening their doors in 2014.

BIG BEAR, CALIFORNIA & FREDERICK, MARYLAND

Programming centers around confidence building and empowering campers to become leaders at camp and within their own communities. In honor of Pride Month, 1% for the Planet Business Member EarthHero partnered with Brave Trails to support their Outdoor Adventures Program.

The program is a week-long immersion where campers learn about outdoor adventure and stewardship, ending with a campout under the stars. EarthHero's donation was used to purchase supplies so that participants could develop skills like reading maps, pitching a tent, planning accessible events and learning Leave No Trace principles.

Lefrik & Village Water

NALOLO DISTRICT, ZAMBIA & MANICA PROVINCE, MOZAMBIQUE

Finding the right nonprofit partner is a key part of 1% for the Planet membership.

Lefrik kicked off their new partnership with Village Water by donating recycled bags to be sold in Village Water's online shop. The bags were an instant fan-favorite among Village Water staff and supporters, with half the stock selling out on the first day.

So far, Lefrik has helped Village Water raise more than £1380, which has helped 46 people access safe water, sanitation and education on preventing the spread of illness.

Organic Basics & WWF-Turkey



GERMENCIK, TURKEY

In 2020, Organic Basics and World Wildlife Fund (WWF) partnered to create the first regenerative cotton farm in Turkey. After drought and other climate issues rendered their original plot of land unusable, the project had to switch gears. They breathed new life into their plan in 2021 by finding a new plot of land and a passionate farmer, Ali, who's leading the way in transitioning the land into a regenerative farm.

The new piece of land is a 78-hectare farm growing cotton and alfalfa. Ali will begin by converting three hectares of the cotton farmland to regenerative practices with a plan to expand to at least six hectares as the program progresses.



"I want to see the benefits of this project and inspire other farmers. I hope one day all farmers will be making regenerative organic cotton."

3Bears & Green Forest Fund



EBERBACH, GERMANY

40% of all food we eat relies on pollination from wild bees. That's why 3Bears is using their 1% for the Planet partnership with Green Forest Fund to protect pollinators and safeguard biodiversity. Together, they purchased and preserved 14,000 square meters of land for their wild bee playground—a safe haven for bees, butterflies and other wildlife.

"We wanted our donation to go to an organization in Germany and the Green Forest Fund inspired us with their approach. With our contribution we can enable a wild bee area the size of two soccer fields. Ultimately, this investment will pay off double or triple for us, because we work with raw materials that nature gives us—and which simply would not exist without bees."

Collective impact through individual action

The UN Secretary General called the 2021 IPCC Report "code red for humanity." For many, this report was not just a projection for years to come, but the current reality as 2021 brought record breaking heat waves, floods, fires and other climate disasters to vulnerable communities around the world.

As we watched our planet continue to change, we also saw a movement grow. With the rapid growth of the 1% for the Planet Individual Member program in the past two years, it's increasingly clear that the climate crisis is motivating people to act.

Today, the program has reached more than 1,200 members—with more than 400 individuals joining in 2021 alone. And with the urgency of the climate crisis and other pressing environmental challenges, our individual members yearned for more meaningful and impactful ways to take action.

INTRODUCING: THE 1% FOR THE PLANET GIVING CIRCLE

In 2021, our new Giving Circle program provided a platform for individual members to connect with one another, share values, learn about environmental solutions and harness the power of collective action to amplify their giving.

Meeting over Zoom, Giving Circle participants created a set of shared values, learned about different environmental organizations and voted on a nonprofit recipient for a collective donation. Participants also learned about Trust-Based Philanthropy to guide their giving and gain a greater understanding of the inherent power imbalance between traditional funders and nonprofits.

2021 GIVING CIRCLE RECIPIENTS:

In 2021, 1% for the Planet hosted two Giving Circles—donating a total of \$7,499 to three environmental organizations focusing on environmental justice and energy independence.







Remote Energy

Remote Energy uses solar energy as an enabling technology to help improve the lives of people in often overlooked communities worldwide by developing and implementing customized online and hands-on solar electric curriculums.

Red Cloud Renewable

Red Cloud Renewable is a nonprofit organization founded by Lakota elder Henry Red Cloud. Its mission is to assist tribal members and communities to move towards energy independence through renewable energy and sustainable living projects and training.

StoveTeam International

StoveTeam International facilitates the placement of lowsmoke, fuel-efficient and safe cookstoves in collaboration with local communities to support families and protect the environment.

"When I joined 1% for the Planet as an individual member, I searched for opportunities to connect with nonprofit partners and other individual members. I connected personally with a number of partners as an in-person and virtual volunteer.

Our organization

For 1% for the Planet, 2021 represented a year of growth. The previous pages illustrate this growth by the numbers—increases in membership, certified giving and nonprofits supported. To keep up with our network's rapid expansion, we grew the 1% for the Planet team, too. This new organizational capacity provided more support for our members—and resulted in profound environmental impact.

However, our growth was not solely in the numbers. Our staff prioritized personal growth as

well—continuing our commitment to environmental justice by listening, learning and holding ourselves accountable as our global movement grows. With this focus, we offered our staff educational opportunities, updated our hiring practices and onboarded more environmental justice-centered nonprofits into our network. And as a result, we limited internal biases, brought new voices to the table and supported more intersectional climate solutions.
